

# Interior Design (ID)



The Interior Design Certificate Program equips students with the drawing, design, applied color, lighting and other skills and knowledge needed to create and implement all phases of an interior design.

Classes address the creative aspects of the field as students develop the discipline and organizational skills at the foundation of a successful business. Color, texture, light and the inherent characteristics of materials interact to convey the language of design, together with such functional concerns as structural and space planning for public and private experiences. This program addresses the importance of collaboration, communication, critical thought, discipline, ethics and organizational skills. Upon completion, students will be prepared to pursue a variety of interior design careers. Note: this non-credit program does not satisfy NCIDQ or ASID eligibility requirements.
